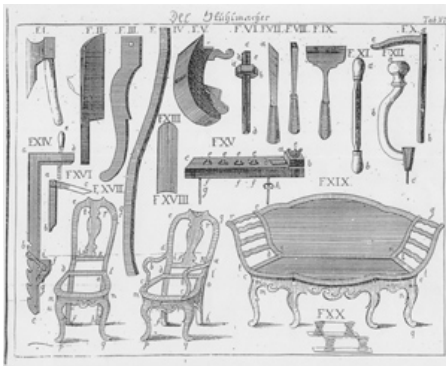

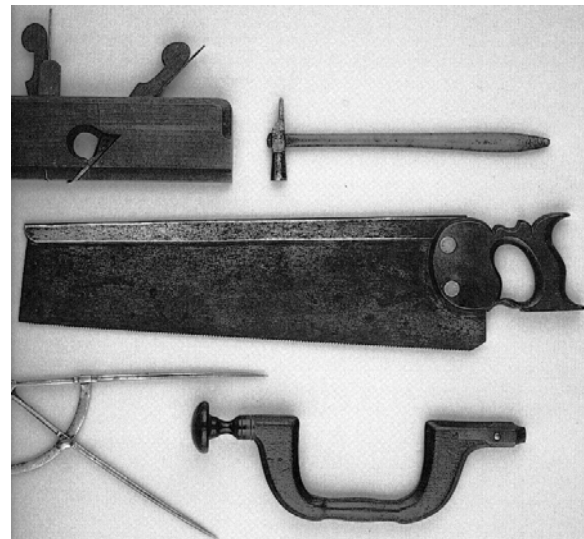

A RARE TUELL'S PATENT SPOKESHAVE

Whenever we visit my wife's parents in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, I always also visit a certain large antique mall in Hershey, about 10 minutes up the road from their house. It's always worth the short trip, because I always find something there worth buying.

In July, 2007, I came across this unusual spokeshave. I could tell right away it was old assumed it was rare. I certainly had never seen one. Although I knew nothing about it, the price was cheap enough even for me!



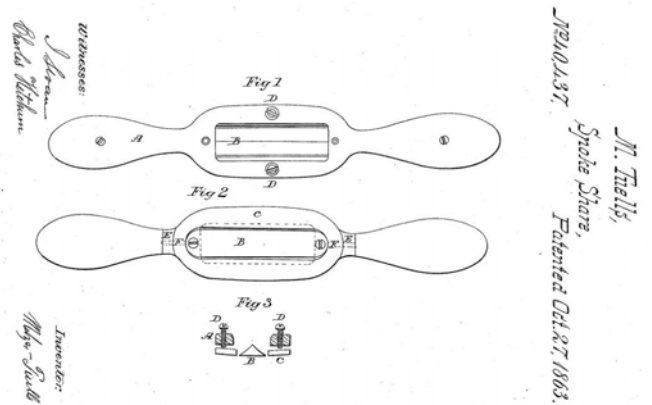
After I got it home and inspected it more closely, I discovered that it had a patent marking on the bottom.



The marking says "TUELES PAT". The date is a bit hard to make out, but it looks like OCT and 27.

After a little research, I found the patent online. Great thing, the Internet!

The patent holder's name was Melzer Tuell, of Penn Yan, New York. The patent was issued Oct. 27, 1863, and relates to the tilting sole plate. To adjust the depth of cut, the user turns the screws on either side of the frame, which adjust the tilting sole plate, opening or closing the throat. The blade is triangular in cross-section and sharpened on both edges.



Mr. Tuell apparently owned a saw mill and also held a few other patents, including one for a planing machine.

It appears that few were produced, and the one I found is the earliest version, with Mr. Tuell's name oddly misspelled on the spokeshave itself. It looks exactly like the patent drawing. It seems likely that some were produced but did not survive. The tilting sole plate is quite thin and would be easily broken.

I looked for any other examples of a shave like this one and found only a couple others on the web, but none were exactly like it. This one came from Martin J. Donnelly's tool auction:



I believe this one is slightly later than the one I found, as it does not match the patent drawing as exactly as mine did, and according to the auction description, it was marked only "Pat."

Because I've decided I'm not really a tool "collector," and it just sat on my desk for three years, I recently sold my Tuell's patent spokeshave to a fellow old tool nut in Australia.

Next time I'll tell you about the Bedrock No. 605 jack plane I found at that antique mall just this past Christmas. Or maybe the crispy clean Stanley No. 2 smoothing plane I bought there a few years ago...
